Eleanor was also a singer. She performed with the Shawnee Choir, Pocono choral Society, various church choirs and the summer choir of East Stroudsburg University.

Additionally, Eleanor was past president and secretary of the Music Study Club of the Stroudsburgs and member of the Music Teachers National Association and Pennsylvania Music Teachers Association. Over the years she taught hundreds of piano and organ students.
