Bach Marathon Report

On March 8, members and friends of the Lehigh Valley Chapter gathered at Egner Memorial Chapel on the campus of Muhlenberg College for a grand Members Recital. Local organists and others presented music in commemoration of the 330th anniversary of the birth of Johann Sebastian Bach. The concert began at 3 p.m. and concluded at 8 p.m. with presenters beginning at half-hour intervals. Some in the audience remained for the entire five hour concert while others stayed as long as their schedules would permit. Musicians for the program included Thomas Dressler, John McEnerney with bass Steve Giblin, the Lehigh Valley Horn Ensemble, Michael Krentz with flautist Catherine

During the summer of 2014, the Muhlenberg College organ underwent a major renovation done by Berghaus Organ Builders, Inc. of Bellwood, Illinois. The organ now has a new movable console with an adjustable bench and a well-lit music rack. The mechanical key action was replaced with electric pulldown magnets. The pneumatic stop action was restored. A new shade controller was added and wood and felt were attached to the shades to allow them to fully close. The console features a new Peterson ICS system giving multiple memories and a greater number of pistons. Tonal additions include a Bombarde playable at 16', 8' and 4' and chimes.

The pipes and pipe chambers were thoroughly cleaned and the pipes were re-voiced resulting in greater volume and presence in the room. This greater presence and clarity were accomplished through re-voicing without altering the existing wind pressure. All reeds were disassembled, cleaned and re-voiced. The Horizontal Trumpet was revoiced to allow it to have a greater compatibility with the overall ensemble. Ongoing maintenance continues to be provided by Emery Brothers, Inc. of Allentown.

Even though the organ is still settling after all of this activity, the positive results of this renovation were

apparent to musicians and listeners alike. To see the console in the center of the Chancel area for the concert was a lovely sight. It was a very satisfying and enjoyable Bach Marathon concert, whether you attended for a part of the time or for the entire event.


