“Playing the Organ While People Sing in Church”

A workshop by Dr. Karl Moyer, FAGO

Saturday, February 7th, 2015 (Feb.21st snow date) 9am-Noon (30 minute coffee and snack break to be provided mid-morning)

Once upon a time, the organist begins the introduction to the next hymn. The hymn is unfamiliar to the congregation. The congregation timidly begins singing verse one. All is well until they begin the middle section of the hymn... the choir begins speeding up as the organist begins slowing down. Suddenly, the congregation changes to 2 different keys as a shaky soprano begins singing a descant in the style of John Cage. The trumpet players attempt to remedy the situation by playing Vivaldi's Gloria. The organist finishes playing verse 3 and forgets to play the 4th verse as a cloud of incense engulfs the choir. The organist swears to herself to never try a new hymn ever again and instead repeat “Amazing Grace” every Sunday for the rest of her career.



But wait! All of a sudden in her local AGO newsletter she sees a notice for a workshop by **Dr. Moyer** on hymn playing called “**Playing the Organ While People Sing in Church.**” At this workshop, there are many organists of

varying levels of proficiency from many different denominations in attendance. A newer organist seated next to her is looking to learn the basics of hymn playing. In the back row sits a virtuoso who is eager for fresh ideas and a new challenge. Another organist is there mostly using the workshop as an excuse to network with colleagues. Another organist there is hoping to refine his congregational leading and accompaniment and better distinguish between the two. Another organist is there hoping to learn how to encourage more a cappella hymn singing in her church. Then Dr. Moyer, a retired Millersville University music professor, combines his decades of practical experience serving various churches in different denominations with good sound scholarship in a witty and enriching presentation that both informs and delights all in attendance.

Enriched by Dr. Moyer's presentation and encouraged by the fellowship and support of her colleagues, the organist returns to her church next Sunday ready to effectively lead the congregation in singing a new song to the glory of God...

My dear colleagues, I heartily invite you and strongly encourage you to attend Dr. Moyer's workshop "Playing the Organ While People Sing in Church," a workshop aimed at inspiring and teaching us to be the most effective leaders of congregational song that we can be.

I also invite you to join me for lunch afterwards at a local restaurant (I'm open to suggestions) for a time of fellowship and discussion. If possible, email me before Feb 7th if you'd like to join me for lunch so I can have a rough head count: busteedtd@gmail.com.

2015 AGO/Quimby Regional Competition

This year, the Lehigh Valley Chapter will be hosting an AGO / Quimby regional competition. If you are 24 years of age or younger as of August 1, 2015, this competition is for you. This year's competition will be held at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Pennsburg, PA on Saturday March 14, 2014. The October 2014 issue of *The American Organist* explains the rules and requirements of the competition. This year, the winner of the Lehigh Valley Chapter regional competition will get a \$1000 stipend and will be invited to play a concert for the chapter's Annual Banquet in May to be held at St. Mark's in Pennsburg. The second place finisher will receive a \$500 award. Note that a competitor must only enter in the AGO region of either the school at which you are enrolled, or the competitor's permanent residence or the chapter of which the competitor has been a member for at least a year. The Lehigh Valley Chapter is in the Mid-Atlantic Region which covers the states of Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia and the District of Columbia.

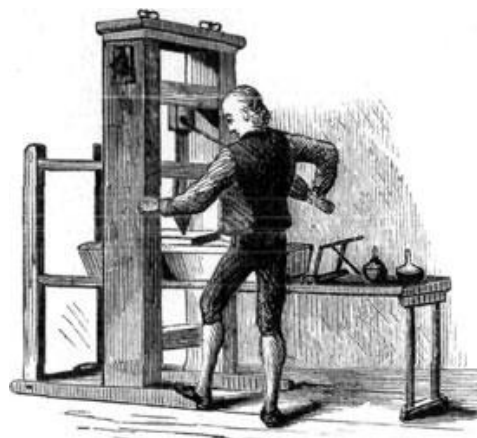
