Dean's Mixtures

It seems like every year someone writes about the need to find some quiet time during Advent, and here I am, saying the same thing. I think no matter which holiday we celebrate at this time of year (Christmas, for the majority of us) it can become a truly hectic time, and we get caught up in all the

details of trying to make traditions happen. I have found it to be a very stressful time for church musicians, as we are trying to please a lot of people with different ideas of what the best tradition might be. I'm the type that wants to make everyone happy, and I become stressed when I know I can't. I find it really necessary to make sure I set aside time to focus on WHY we celebrate and WHAT is important. I find the Liturgy of the Hours very helpful. I set aside a half hour every morning for the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer, and that helps me at least remember why we do this routine every



year. We all have something that we can use to focus on what it's all about. Reconnect to whatever your spiritual tradition, keep reminding yourself of WHAT it is we celebrate (and it's not Christmas cookies, or Santa Claus, or a Christmas tree, or even fabulous Christmas music, though those things really help bring fun and focus to the season.) Remember we can't make everyone happy but one thing we can do is remind people what we are reminding ourselves in our quiet time.
