## Dean's Article

How many times would you estimate you have played "Silent Night" in your capacity as a church organist? Most of the churches I've served have had three, and in some cases, four services each Christmas Eve, so multiplying that by sixty years (time flies when you're having fun!), conservatively I've played that hymn well over 200 times. Being in a vocation that too often makes us feel overworked, unappreciated and underpaid, the average person would think it must be deadly boring to have to play the same hymns over and over again. And yet as I play "Silent Night" I love to watch the faces of children (and even adults) light up when the candlelight slowly illuminates the darkness as the singing gently begins. It's pure magic. As I play the familiar verses, I think to myself: someone is experiencing the beauty of this moment for the first time in their life, someone is experiencing this for the last time in their life, someone is singing this hymn for the first time with someone they love, someone is singing this for the first time after they've lost someone they love. And so that hymn transforms into a vessel of comfort and of hope, as does every hymn in our rich Christian heritage of hymns and spiritual songs. We are beginning a brand new year, facing an unknown future that is frightening on so many levels. And yet in every worship service we organists serve as musical messengers of God's unfailing love and strength. Let us continue to freshly inspire congregational singing by the spirit with which we play the peoples' songs. May God richly bless you as you lead your congregation in worship in 2025!
